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What a remote community connector is

Remote community connectors (RCCs) work for [NDIS partners](#) who help people with disability in remote or very remote communities.

There is a network of about 200 RCCs helping people across 480 remote communities.

What a remote community connector is for

RCCs can help you:

- understand the NDIS and how to apply
- with your current supports
- prepare for check-ins
- understand how to use your NDIS plan
- with questions you may have about the NDIS
- access supports and services
- with translations services to communicate with the NDIA and service providers.

Tip: Remote community connectors are not healthcare professionals.

They can't provide healthcare support for your disability but can connect you with health professionals in your area.

For example, occupational therapists or a general practitioner.

They can also help connect you with health professionals who can provide you with the [evidence](#) you may need when applying or making changes to your NDIS plan.
